 of old toys and clothes, find a local charity you can donate to and take your child with
 you to drop them off!
- Look for ways to reuse and recycle household items you already have. Make a
 commitment to recycle or reuse one thing in your home (reusing coffee grounds for a
 deodorizer, refilling plastic water bottles, etc.).
