- Listen to others without interrupting

For The Heart of Your Child

Here are some opportunities to reinforce at home what your child is learning at school:

- Play "Simon Says" with your child to practice listening skills. Talk about why listening to others during the game is important.
- Have your child practice the following phrases to encourage respectful communication:
 - "Excuse me, please" and then wait for a reply, before interrupting.
 - "Thank you for your idea. My idea is different. I'd like to share it with you."
- When engaging in conversation with your child, make sure you and your child use good listening skills—the body is still, eyes are on the speaker, mouth is closed, and there is no interrupting.

We hope you take time this week to invest in your child's manners as they learn to respect the rights of others through good conversation.
