- Insist your child picks up after him/herself. Even if you must give several reminders, make sure it is your child who is picking up.
- Make sure your child helps clean up their mess at a friend's house before coming home.
- It takes longer to get things done, but if you encourage your children to help with cleanup at home, they will be more appreciative and will learn to share in other duties as they grow up.
- Set a good example for your children. They will learn to appreciate their belongings if they observe the way you take care of your things and see how you pick up after yourself.
