You can help reinforce your child's development of self-control in conversation! Try these quick tips at home this week:


- Take turns asking each other questions and listening to responses. When you hear your child asking questions and listening in conversations, be sure to praise them for good conversation!
- Tell your child about a time when you learned something very important by listening. Tell your child about another time when you made a mistake because you did not listen well in a conversation.

Be sure to thank your child for listening during conversations, not just to directions. You and your child will enjoy talking more and sharing more, too!
