Here are some ways to reinforce your child's new learning this week:

- Ask your child to describe Getting to Know You, a Merryville story about two friends, Sarah and Allie. Sarah and Allie learn that their relationship is based mainly on the texting and calling they do on their phones. They discover they need to spend time really getting to know one another.
- This week, your child is thinking about No Phone Zones, places where it is better to not be
 on a phone. Ask your third grader to name some of these zones! Here are some of the ones
 we talked about:
 - Library
 - Restaurant
 - Movies
 - Family Dinner Table
 - Car
- Spending less time in front of a screen and more time getting to know those we love is good for all of us!
